2018-19 School Improvement Report - Summary

- We received very positive feedback from Education Scotland Inspectors last session who praised the excellent learning experiences we provide for our children.
- Staff have an increased understanding, awareness and confidence to promote positive mental health and emotional wellbeing in children.
- All staff and children have undertaken training in mindfulness techniques through the 'Do be Mindful programme'
- We have launched a successful Building Resilience programme for pupils.
- We have delivered Health and Wellbeing workshops to parents in partnership with Parentspace.
- Early level staff have attended training on Emerging Literacy approaches.
- Emerging Literacy approaches have been used across all areas of early level provision.
- Our teaching staff have demonstrated confidence with the benchmark standards at each level through collaboration and moderation in order to inform teacher judgement.
- Moderation across the cluster has developed a shared understanding of achievement of a level.
- Focused interventions in literacy and numeracy have led to an increase in attainment.
- We have held successful Easter and Summer family fun sessions which has led to improved relationships between school, parent ' carers and partners.

2018-19 School Improvement Plan- Key areas for improvement

- Improving the Health and Wellbeing with a focus on developing positive relationships across the school community.
- Staff to develop their understanding of positive behaviour strategies through the Pivotal Education training programme.
- Continue to develop and improve learning and teaching on our journey to excellence.
- Continue to implement the Building Resilience programme for Nursery - P7.
- Update our sexual health programme and develop our approaches to equality and diversity.
- Improving our interdisciplinary curriculum to reflect the local context, children's interests and development of skills, knowledge and understanding ensuring breadth and balance.
- Develop our approaches to reporting to parents/carers through our new online Learning Journals.
- Continue raising attainment in numeracy.
- Analysis of SNSA data to inform planning and next steps in pupil attainment.
